SPIRITUAL MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SUSAN

From "God's Message for Each Day" by Eugene Peterson

"When Moses returned from the mountain of revelation, his face was shining so brightly that the people could not look on it. The Aaronic benediction prayers, "The LORD make His face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you. . ." (Numbers 6:25) This is part of the benediction that I close with almost every Sunday. In Christ the blessing of God is made personal in the shining face: "His face was like the sun shining in full strength." God in Christ is warmth and sunlight."

You probably recall the Sunday of Transfiguration where Jesus' clothing was brighter than any sun, reminiscent of this Moses passage, indicating that each were in the presence of the LORD.

While we don't shine like the sun on the outside, we can shine like the sun on the inside every time we worship God on Sunday or any other day.

Below is the full Aaronic blessing: (meaning the blessing that was given from God by Aaron, the high priest of the Israelites during the Exodus.)

Numbers 6:24-26

the LORD make His face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you;
the LORD lift up HIS countenance upon you, and give you peace,

FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF COLDWATER STATED MEETING OF SESSION THURSDAY, MARCH 13, 2025

Pastor Susan opened the Meeting at 6:05 p.m. with a prayer.

Session welcomed Michael Bryan and Rev. Kristin Stroble from the Lake Michigan Presbytery Commission on Ministry (COM) for a discussion of ways to address concerns about the sustainability of the Church and Susan's parttime status. Suggestions included a mediation service offered by the Presbytery, which Session would need to invite; listening sessions with small groups of Congregation members; and annual Pastor evaluations by the Personnel Committee. COM will follow up on the discussion.

The Agenda was approved on a motion by Paul Hershberger, supported by Chris Doll.

DEACON'S REPORT: Bob Montgomery gave the report. We have a shortage of Deacons. A Deacon will be assigned as Deacon of the Month for two consecutive months. We are satisfied with the current procedures for Communion, with tearing the bread from a loaf.

CLERK'S REPORT: The Minutes of the February 20, 2025 Session Meeting were approved on a motion by Paul Hershberger, supported by Bruce Gregory. Bruce Gregory made a motion, supported by Jan Breckinridge, to accept the Clerk's Report. The motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Susan reported on the use of her time. Tommy's House asked the Church to sponsor a table at its May 2, 2025 fundraising event at the Methodist Church. There will be a catered Italian meal with music. The cost is \$100. Paul Hershberger made a motion, supported by Jan Breckinridge, to sponsor a table. The motion passed.

Debbie Coleman and Kenny Kozial have asked to use the Church for their wedding on Saturday, September 20, 2025 at 2:00 p.m. There will be a rehearsal the night before. The reception will not be held at the Church. Jan Breckinridge made a motion, supported by Carol Ludlow, to approve the request. The motion passed.

On February 25, 2025, five churches met to hear from Joe Scheid, Director of Public Safety with the Coldwater Police Department. He discussed various practices churches were using to ensure the safety of their parishioners. He recommended keeping doors locked during services, being aware of all points of entry, cutting back bushes, and using cameras.

There will be an Ecumenical Service with the Methodist and Episcopal Churches at Noon on Good Friday (April 18).

Session will discuss the first chapter of "Canoeing the Mountain" at the April Session Meeting.

Session discussed the suggestion to pass out water bottles at Community events like the Strawberry Festival on June 21, 2025 and the Apple Festival on September 20, 2025.

Susan reported on the Presbytery Meeting on March 8, 2025.

Pete Metters made a motion, supported by Bruce Gregory, to accept the Pastor's Report. The motion passed.



Prep: **25 min. •** Bake: **30 min.** Makes: **9 servings**

- 8 oz. uncooked medium egg
- noodles (about 4 cups)

 cans (5 oz. each) light tuna
- cans (5 oz. each) light tuna
 in water, drained
 cups frozen peas and carrots
- cups frozen peas and carrots
 (about 10 oz.), thawed
 small onion, finely chopped
- 1 small onion, finely chopped 2 cups shredded cheddar

1. Preheat the oven to 350°. In a 6-qt. stockpot, cook noodles according to package directions; drain and return to pot. Add tuna, peas and carrots, onion and 1 cup chapse.

Prep: 20 min. + chilling Makes: 14 servings

- 4 oz. fat-free cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup fat-free vanilla yogurt

- cups fat-free milk
 pkg. (3.4 oz.) instant
 lemon pudding mix
- 2 tsp. grated lemon zest 2½ cups sliced fresh
- strawberries, divided


 1 Tbsp. white grape juice

- 1. In a large bowl, beat cream cheese and yogurt. Add milk, pudding mix and lemon zest; beat until smooth.

In a blender, process ½ cup strawberries and grape juice until blended. 2. Cut cake into 1-in. cubes; place a third in a trifle bowl or 3-qt. serving bowl. Top with a third of the pudding mixture and half the remaining strawberries. Drizzle

with a bird of the puoling mixture and half the remaining strawberries. Drizzle with half the strawberry sauce. Repeat layers. Top with remaining cake and pudding mixture. If desired, garnish with whipped topping and additional strawberries. Cover and refrigerate at least 2 hours.
