## SPIRITUAL MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SUSAN

### Pastoral Prayers - Advent

O God, our help in ages past and our hope for years to come: At the outset of a new Christian year, we come to your house once again with adoration and thanksgiving, because you have come to us with seeking love through Moses and the prophets and supremely in the person of Jesus.

You have been worshiped in this church for more than 187 years. Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, that we may meet the challenges of this dawning year in the spirit of him who came to us as a little child, but grew up to be a man with a mission: the proclamation of your justice and your mercy. We recall with grateful hearts his sublime teachings, his miracles of healing and the unique miracle of his victory over death. Because he came to us, loved us, lived for us, died for us, rose for us, we pray that you will keep us faithful to him in both life and death. Help us to learn from him how to live differently, regardless of what people may say about us or do to us. ## Sicilian Brussels Sprouts

I love to make this dish because the flavors jumping around in your mouth keep you coming back bite after bite.

—Marsha Gillett, Yukon, OK

Prep: 30 min. • Bake: 20 min.  
Makes: 12 servings

- 12 oz. pancetta, diced
- 2 lbs. fresh Brussels sprouts, halved
- 3 Tbsp. capers, drained

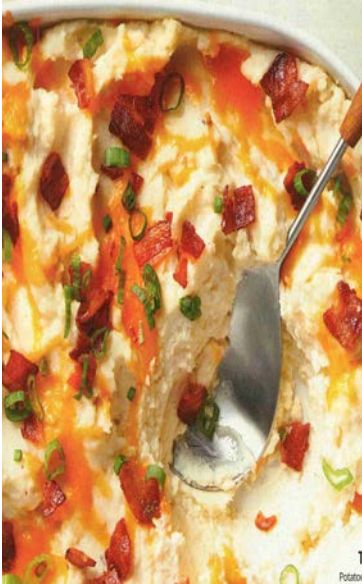
- ¼ cup olive oil
- 3 Tbsp. champagne vinegar
- 1 tsp. lemon juice
- ¼ tsp. salt
- ¼ tsp. pepper
- ¾ cup golden raisins
- ½ cup pine nuts, toasted
- 1 tsp. grated lemon zest

1. In a large cast-iron or other ovenproof skillet, cook pancetta over medium heat until browned. Remove to paper towels with a slotted spoon.

2. Add Brussels sprouts to pan; cook and stir until lightly browned. Remove from heat. Stir in capers, oil, vinegar, lemon juice, salt and pepper.

3. Bake, uncovered, at 350° until caramelized, stirring occasionally, 15-20 minutes. Add the raisins, pine nuts, lemon zest and pancetta; toss to coat.

## Creamy Make-Ahead Mashed Potatoes

My recipe takes mashed potatoes to the next level with a savory topping of cheese, onions and bacon.

Prep: 35 min. + chilling • Bake: 40 min.  
Makes: 10 servings

- 3 lbs. potatoes (about 9 medium), peeled and cubed
- 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
- ½ cup sour cream
- ½ cup butter, cubed
- ¼ cup 2% milk
- 1½ tsp. onion powder

- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- ½ tsp. pepper
- Optional: Shredded cheddar cheese, crumbled cooked bacon and chopped green onions

1. Place potatoes in a Dutch oven; cover with water. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cook, uncovered, 10-15 minutes or until tender. Drain potatoes; return to pan.

2. Mash potatoes, gradually adding the cream cheese, sour cream and

butter. Stir in milk and seasonings. Transfer to a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. If desired, sprinkle with cheese and bacon. Refrigerate, covered, up to 2 days.

3. Preheat oven to 350°. Remove potatoes from refrigerator and let stand while the oven heats. Bake, covered, 30 minutes. Uncover; bake 10 minutes longer or until heated through. If desired, sprinkle with green onion.

## Spiced Pistachio Pumpkin Bread

This savory loaf is a nice surprise compared with sweet pumpkin loaves. Serve it with soup and salad, or toast a slice and slather it with butter.

Prep: 30 min. • Bake: 65 min. + cooling  
Makes: 2 loaves (16 pieces each)

- 3 Tbsp. butter
  - 1 cup chopped shelled pistachios
  - ½ tsp. ground turmeric
  - ½ tsp. ground cumin
  - ¼ tsp. cayenne pepper
- BATTER
- ¾ cup butter, softened

- 2⅔ cups sugar
- 4 large eggs, room temperature
- 1 can (15 oz.) pumpkin
- ¾ cup water
- 3½ cups self-rising flour
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice

1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a small saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Cook until butter is golden brown, 5-7 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from heat; stir in the pistachios, turmeric, cumin and cayenne. Let cool.

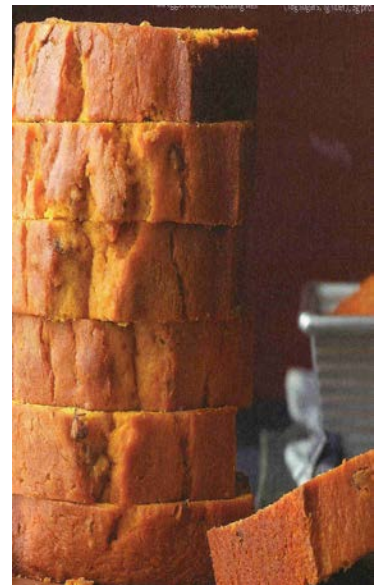
2. For batter, in a large bowl, beat the butter and sugar until crumbly. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating well

after each addition. Beat in pumpkin and water. In another bowl, whisk flour and pie spice; add to butter mixture just until moistened. Fold in pistachio mixture.

3. Transfer to 2 greased 9x5-in. loaf pans. Bake until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, 65-70 minutes. Cool in pans 10 minutes before removing to wire rack to cool completely.

**FREEZE OPTION** Securely wrap cooled loaves in foil, then freeze. To use, thaw at room temperature.
