

# FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF COLDWATER STATED MEETING OF SESSION THURSDAY, APRIL 24, 2025

Pastor Susan opened the Meeting at 6:03 p.m. with a prayer.

The Agenda was approved on a motion by Pete Metters, supported by Jan Breckinridge.

DEACON'S REPORT: Session reviewed the minutes of the April 6, 2025 Board of Deacons meeting.

CLERK'S REPORT: The Minutes of the March 13, 2025 Session Meeting were approved on a motion by Paul

Hershberger, supported by Linda Stewart.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Susan reported on the use of her time. The Holy Week Easter services went well. About 100 children attended the Easter egg hunt, although it ended an hour early due to cold temperatures and rain.

Linda Beach asked Susan to do a memorial service for Kevin Earl, who passed away on March 14, 2025. We previously did memorial services for Kevin's mother and brother. Linda will meet with Susan on Monday, April 28 to discuss the services. Linda Stewart made a motion, supported by Carol Ludlow, to have Susan do the memorial service. The motion passed.

An Ecumenical Good Friday service was hosted by the Church and Pastor Susan with five additional area pastors.

Reverend Kristin Stroble provided information on how to contact the Presbytery's Mediation Committee.

The moderator is Reverend Scott Scheel. Pete Metters will contact him.

Jan Breckinridge made a motion, supported by Chris Doll, to accept the Pastor's Report. The motion passed. TREASURER'S REPORT:

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Building & Grounds.</u> Session reviewed and discussed damage from the recent storm. The Church's electric service went out and the refrigerator and fire alarms were activated. Multiple boxes of temperature sensitive insulin were packed in coolers and taken off site until power was restored. The Narthex doors were damaged. The steeple lost a small section of vinyl siding near the top of the Bell Tower. One smoke detector was found non-functional and was replaced. We have a new contract with CertaSite to check and maintain the fire alarms annually.

<u>Finance</u>. Session reviewed the proposed 2025 Budget, which projects revenue of \$147,000, expenses of \$223,786 and a deficit of \$76,786. Motion from the Finance Committee to approve the Budget. No second was required. The motion passed.

Session received and discussed the proof of cash report of the review by Pete Metters and Dennis Farwell of the Church's financial records and condition through December 31, 2024. Jan Breckinrige made a motion, supported by Linda Stewart, to acknowledge the financial review. The motion passed.

The Finance Committee made a motion to update the Church's property and liability insurance policy. Maintaining the current coverage would cost 24% more the new policy. The main change would be a reduction in coverage to 80% of the replacement value of property. That would reduce the premium from \$11,284 to \$9,795, saving 13%. No second was required for the motion. The proposed changes were approved.

Paul Hershberger made a motion, supported by Carol Ludlow, to invest \$50,000 from the Memorial Fund in certificates of deposit at the Southern Michigan Bank & Trust to increase the interest return. The motion passed.

Fellowship Committee. Session thanked the Fellowship Committee for an excellent Easter Brunch.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

2025 Congregational Meeting. Paul Hershberger a motion, supported by Chris Doll, to hold the Annual Congregational Meeting after services on Sunday, June 8, 2025. The motion passed.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Columbarium. We only have space left for four more memorial plaques. Building a place for additional plaques will be very costly. Paul Hershberger made a motion, supported by Carol Ludlow, to increase the burial fee from \$200 to \$500 to raise funds. The motion passed.

CLOSING PRAYER/ADJOURNMENT: Chris Doll made a motion, supported by Jan Breckinridge, to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed. Pastor Susan closed the meeting at 7:39 p.m. with a prayer.

#### Lemon Olive Oil Cake

Olive oil cakes stay tender and moist longer than butter-based cakes, so they are a great option if you need to make dessert ahead of time.

Prep: 15 min.
Bake: 30 min. + cooling
Makes: 8 servings

- 2 large eggs, room temperature
- 3/3 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1/3 cup 2% milk
- 1 Tbsp. grated lemon zest
- 3 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- ¼ tsp. salt Confectioners' sugar

1. Preheat the oven to 350°. Line a greased 8-in. round baking pan with parchment. In a large bowl, beat eggs on high speed 3 minutes. Gradually add sugar, beating until thickened. Gradually beat in oil. Beat in milk, lemon zest and lemon juice.

2. In another bowl, whisk flour, baking powder and salt; fold into the egg mixture. Transfer batter to prepared pan, spreading evenly. Bake until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, 30-35 minutes. Cool in pan for 15 minutes before removing to a wire rack; remove parchment. Cool completely. Dust with confectioners' supar.

#### **Buffalo Chicken Biscuits**

These spicy, savory muffins are always a hit at parties. We love them as a simple snack on game day too.

Prep: 20 min. • Bake: 25 min. Makes: 1 dozen

- 3 cups chopped rotisserie chicken
- 1/4 cup Louisiana-style hot sauce
- 2 cups biscuit/baking mix
- 1/4 tsp. celery seed 1/8 tsp. pepper
- 1 large egg, room temperature
- ½ cup 2% milk
- 1/4 cup ranch salad dressing
- 1½ cups shredded Colby-Monterey Jack cheese, divided
- 2 green onions, thinly sliced Optional: Additional ranch dressing and hot sauce
- 1. Preheat oven to 400°. Toss chicken with hot sauce. In a large bowl, whisk together baking mix, celery seed and pepper. In another bowl, whisk together egg, milk and dressing; add to dry ingredients, stirring just until moistened. Fold in 1 cup cheese, green onions and chicken mixture.

 Spoon into 12 greased muffin cups.
 Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, 25-30 minutes.

3. Cool 5 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack. Serve warm. Serve with additional dressing and hot sauce if desired. Refrigerate leftovers.

- 12 corn tortillas (6 in.), warmed Cooking spray
- 2 cups shredded rotisserie chicken
- 1 cup salsa

- 1 can (16 oz.) refried beans 1 cup shredded reduced-fat Mexican cheese blend Optional toppings: Shredded lettuce, reduced-fat sour cream, chopped cilantro, diced avocado, sliced jalapeno, lime wedges, sliced ripe olives, sliced green onions, sliced radishes, and pico de gallo or additional salsa
- 1. Preheat oven to 425°. Press warm tortillas into 12 muffin cups coated

with cooking spray, pleating sides as needed. Spritz tortillas with additional cooking spray.

2. Bake 5-7 minutes or until lightly browned. Toss chicken with salsa. Layer each cup with beans, chicken mixture and cheese.
